You will have the opportunity to learn the frameworks of language and to consider how these affect your interpretations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS / SUITABILITY:

5 GCSEs at A*-C or Grades 5 - 8. Students are required to have achieved a Grade B/6 in both GCSE English Literature and GCSE English Language.

Candidates who study this course must have a love of reading! You should be interested in creative writing and should enjoy exploring language. You should also have the ability to construct a critical argument and select precise quotations from a text. Independent learning and research is an important

CONTENT:

Year 12

Component 1: Candidates will study an Anthology of various texts in which they will complete a piece of creative writing based on one of these texts and an analytical essay.

Component 2: Candidates explore two texts (e.g. 'Dracula' by Bram Stoker and 'Oleanna' by Mamet).

Year 13

Component 3: Voices in Speech and Writing
Candidates will study an Anthology and a play (e.g. 'Top Girls' by Caryl Churchill).

Component 4: Varieties in Language & Literature
Candidates will study two texts (e.g. 'The Great Gatsby' by F. Scott Fitzgerald and 'Othello' by Shakespeare) and there will also be an unseen element to the exam.

LEADS TO:

Studying Language and Literature means you can go on to pursue careers in a diverse range of roles and sectors. Often English graduates will choose to utilise their strong communication skills, along with their detailed knowledge of the written word. Popular career options are Journalism and jobs within the media industry. Graduates in English are able to use their skills to work within editorial or production within print, online or broadcast media. Publishing careers are also another popular option for those who have a love of Language and Literature.
